Homeschool Days at the Molly Brown House Museum offer non-traditional students an unique opportunity to experience the museum and its programs.

The Life of the Brown's - February 9, 2021

Who was the "Unsinkable" Margaret Tobin Brown? How did the Brown's come to live in Denver? Was she ever called Molly? Come find out the answers to these questions and more as we explore Colorado's early history through the life of the Brown's.

Exploration and Survival - March 9, 2021

Explore history from the point of view of the people who explored and survived in our state. Using primary and secondary sources, along with artifacts/replicas, explore the lives of miners, indigenous people, fur trappers, and pioneers to gain a greater understanding of what life was like in early Colorado.

Sinking of the Titanic - April 13, 2021

It was a night to remember, and a night that no one who survived would ever forget. But who were the people aboard the *Titanic*? What can the objects and documents they left behind tell us about their worlds? In this interactive program, students will become someone who sailed on the *Titanic* and will compare and contrast their experiences on and off the ship with the lives of other passengers and crew.

Historic Preservation - May 11, 2021

1340 Pennsylvania Street nearly became a parking lot until a group of historic preservationists stepped in. Learn what it took to save the house, make your own historic buildings, and see some of the other buildings in and around Capitol Hill that have withstood the test of time and urban renewal.

A Servant's Life - June 7, 2021

Learn what life was like for the men and women who were servants of the Brown family. We will explore the house through their eyes, see where they would have lived, and learn more about the individuals who worked in the home.



J.J.'s Story - September 14, 2021

We all know about Margaret "Molly" Brown, but what about her husband JJ? Learn about JJ's life in the mine industry, the history of mining in Colorado, and how mineral wealth changed the Brown's future forever.



Trick or Treat? - October 12, 2021

During the Victorian era, the celebration of Halloween took hold in America and many of today's customs were developed. While costumes and decoration are now different than those in "Molly" Brown's time, the mystery and surprise of Halloween is a sentiment we still celebrate.

Game Day - November 9, 2021

On Thanksgiving, many families will gather around the television to watch football. What did the Browns do instead? Come play some games and learn about sports in early Denver as we gear up for family gatherings this Fall!

Deck the Halls - December 7, 2021

We're decking the halls Victorian-style! Have you ever wondered where some of our most beloved Christmas traditions come from? Come find out as we explore what Christmas was like for a Victorian family like the Browns!
